PREPARACIÓN PARA EMERGENCIAS

Las leyes de Florida requieren que todos los condados se registren voluntariamente y ayuden a las personas que necesitan ayuda para evacuar a refugios públicos en una situación de emergencia.

Durante la temporada de huracanes, del 1 de junio al 30 de noviembre, se proporcionará información adicional en su paquete de información.

Para su seguridad, hemos incluido información de los CDC, FEMA y otras agencias gubernamentales para ayudar en situaciones de emergencia. Lea este material y consérvelo para consultarlo en el futuro.

En caso de una emergencia, comuníquese con el 911.

Comuníquese con el (407) 437-9322 para una emergencia que no sea de vida o muerte.

SEGURIDAD

En caso de una situación de emergencia natural o creada en el área, como un huracán, inundaciones o disturbios civiles, es posible que el personal de la agencia no esté disponible o no pueda visitar a los pacientes en sus hogares.

La responsabilidad de la atención del paciente / cliente será asumida por el paciente / cliente, el cuidador, las autoridades locales y el médico del paciente, según corresponda, hasta que sea seguro reanudar la atención domiciliar. Se hará todo lo posible para evitar la interrupción de la atención y para restablecer la atención lo más rápido posible cuando sea seguro hacerlo.

Artículo para llevar a un refugio:

- Agua y comida (suministro para 3 días)
- Ropa y ropa de cama
- Artículos personales, artículos de tocador y medicamentos
- Suministros de primeros auxilios
- Papeles importantes
- Artículos diversos como juegos, juguetes, radios a pilas y linternas
- Tarjeta de identificación Tarjeta de información médica
- Diaria recetas médicas (suministro para 2 semanas)
- Medicamentos sin receta (suministro para 2 semanas)
- Cargador de teléfono móvil, si es necesario
- Otros artículos especiales como anteojos, audífonos, prótesis, andadores, alimentos dietéticos especiales, etc.
- Suministros médicos que utiliza a diario, esto incluye oxígeno portátil, cánula, kit de prueba de diabetes, nebulizador, etc.
- Un libro, revista o algo para ocupar su tiempo mientras espera que pase la tormenta.

Osceola County Emergency Management and partners have demonstrated consistent excellence in the planning and execution of the Special Needs Program.

The program includes annual registration and education for individuals with special needs. During periods of threatened conditions, Osceola County provides special needs sheltering for those who require sheltering. Partner organizations, such as the Osceola Council On Aging and the Department of Health, come together to ensure the utmost in care during a sheltering event. Orange County Shelters

General, Special Needs, & Pet-Friendly

Orange County provides hurricane and storm shelters as part of its comprehensive response to help individuals, families and communities respond to and recover from disasters. There are no emergency shelters open at this time. For registration and information on Special Needs Shelters, please call 311.

GENERAL SHELTERS

Orange County provides general population shelters for Central Floridians who have been evacuated from their homes, for those who live in low-lying areas, and for others seeking shelter from a storm. Shelters are alcohol, drug and weapon free. Individuals should come prepared with supplies.

SPECIAL NEEDS SHELTERS

Orange County strongly encourages residents who require a Special Needs/Medical Shelter during an emergency to please call 311. Residents who are deaf or hard of hearing can [chat online](#), download the [OCFL 311 app](#), or register at www.ocfl.net/psn, to ensure access to resources and transportation.

ITEMS TO BRING:

Items to bring to the shelter include:

- Water and food (3-day supply)
- Clothing and bedding
- Personal items, toiletries and medications
- First-aid supplies
- Important papers
- Miscellaneous items like games, toys, battery-powered radios and flashlights
- Identification card
- Medical Information card
- Daily prescriptions (2-week supply)
- Non-prescription medicines (2-week supply)
- Mobile phone charger, if needed
- Other special items such as eyeglasses, hearing aids, prosthetic devices, walkers, special dietary foods, etc.
- Medical supplies that you utilize on a daily basis, this includes any portable oxygen, cannula, diabetes testing kit, nebulizer, etc.
- A book, magazine, or something to occupy your time while you wait for the storm to pass

The American Red Cross and/or Salvation Army provides food at the shelters. You are encouraged to bring some food, snacks, and water with you.

In addition, please bring the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of family and friends should you need to contact them or to provide information of your whereabouts. Also, leave your ~~personal~~ ^{personal} ~~light on~~ ^{light on} this will assist the authorities that come around your neighborhood after the storm to

SHELTER INFORMATION

Seminole County provides two (2) different types of evacuation shelters – general population and medically enhanced (special needs). A "pet-friendly" designation is provided to specific shelters which are equipped to allow animals at the facility.

General Population shelters provide basic food services and 21 square feet of space/per individual. Cots are not provided at general population shelters (before and during hurricanes). Dependent on availability, all efforts are made to provide cots post-disaster.

Emergency Preparedness Plans for Individuals with Special Needs

The Brevard County Special Needs program is for residents with specific health and/or medical conditions needing assistance with sheltering in times of an emergency or disaster during an evacuation. Residents who meet the Special Needs criteria and have no other alternative for a safe shelter should register with Emergency Management.

You can register in the following ways:

- By calling [321-637-6670](#)
- You can also talk to your home health care agency, hospice agency, medical supply company, or other caregiver, who can assist with completing and application.

Once registered, annual updates are required to keep information up-to-date.

For Special Needs Clients with Pets

As part of the Special Needs registration application, there will be space provided to share information about your pets. Due to health concerns, pets are NOT allowed in Special Needs shelters, so when it comes time to go to the shelter, you will receive a call which will verify your need to be taken to a shelter and pet information. You will be given an approximate time that you will be picked up and Animal Services will pick up your pet. You will need to have your disaster kit, your pet, and their items ready. Once the emergency has passed, and you have returned home, Animal Services will return your pet.

Transportation Assistance to a Shelter

Transportation is free to all Special Needs and primary evacuation shelters, and will be provided to residents who register a transportation request either as a part of a special needs application or if a resident has no means of transport to a shelter. Transportation will only be provided to and from a shelter. No other destinations will be provided.

Special Needs Planning

La siguiente información debe ser proporcionada por la agencia de salud en el hogar a aquellos pacientes registrados en el registro de necesidades especiales, para que estén preparados antes de una evacuación a un refugio para necesidades especiales.

Tenga en cuenta: El refugio para personas con necesidades especiales debe utilizarse como último refugio. Es posible que el evacuado no reciba el mismo nivel de atención que recibe del personal en el hogar, y las condiciones en un refugio pueden ser estresantes.

(1) Si el paciente tiene un cuidador, el cuidador debe acompañar al paciente y debe permanecer con el paciente en el refugio para necesidades especiales.

(2) La siguiente es una lista de lo que los pacientes con necesidades especiales deben llevar consigo al refugio para necesidades especiales durante una evacuación:

- **Sábanas, mantas, almohada, silla de jardín plegable, colchón de aire**
- **Lista de medicamentos, suministros y equipo del paciente suministrados por la agencia de atención médica a domicilio, incluidos el teléfono, el buscapersonas y los números de emergencia del médico, la farmacia y, si corresponde, el proveedor de oxígeno del paciente; suministros y equipo médico para el cuidado del paciente; Formulario de No reanimar (DNRO), si corresponde;**
- **Nombre y número de teléfono de la agencia de atención médica domiciliaria del paciente.**
- **Medicamentos con receta y sin receta necesarios durante al menos 72 horas; oxígeno durante 72 horas, si es necesario. · una copia del plan de cuidado del paciente**
- **Identificación y dirección actual**
- **artículos dietéticos, alimentos no perecederos durante 72 horas y 1 galón de agua por persona por día · Glasses, auditiva ayudantes y**

baterías, prótesis y otros dispositivos de ayuda

- **Artículos de higiene personal por 72 horas**
- **Ropa extra por 72 horas**
- **Linterna y baterías**
- **Artículos recreativos y de entretenimiento personal, como libros, revistas y juegos tranquilos.**

(3) Refugiado necesita saber lo siguiente:

- **Si el paciente tiene un cuidador, el cuidador (es) se le permitirá refugiarse juntos en el refugio para necesidades especiales. Si la persona con necesidades especiales es responsable del cuidado de personas sin necesidades especiales, esas personas también pueden refugiarse juntas.**
- **Se proporcionará espacio en el piso al cuidador protegido. El cuidador debe proporcionar su propia ropa de cama.**
- **Se permiten perros de servicio en el refugio. Sin embargo, consulte con su oficina local de Manejo de Emergencias para ver si se permiten otras mascotas.**
- **Traiga refrigerios personales, bebidas y cualquier alimento dietético especial durante 72 horas. Es posible que solo se proporcionen comidas escasas.**
- **Se espera que los cuidadores que asisten regularmente al paciente en el hogar continúen prestando el mismo cuidado en el refugio.**
